

# Betty Sergun

1929-2024

Betty Ruth (Lichtenberger) Sergun, age 95, of Arnold, died May 3, 2024, at the Callaway Good Life Center on her 95th birthday. What a great gift for her to see her Lord and Savior and her husband Al.

Betty was born May 3, 1929, at Callaway, Nebraska, to Roy and Alma Lichtenberger. She was the eldest of five children. She told stories of living near the river and swimming with her siblings.

Betty kept busy raising chickens and planting a large garden. Betty sold the eggs to Watson Grocery Store in Arnold. Betty always claimed that the egg money paid for all the groceries, and all the doctor bills after each child was born.

Al and Betty sold the farm in 1982 and moved to Arnold. Betty kept gardening and raising flowers. She also started cleaning homes and enjoyed talking with her clients.

Betty and Al were very active in the Arnold Baptist Church. They taught Sunday School class and had a weekly Bible study in their home. Al passed in 1994. Betty continued to make her home in Arnold. Betty moved to the Callaway Good Life Center after breaking her hip. You could always count on Betty reading when you went to visit, and her favorite book was the Bible.

Betty was preceded in death by her husband Al; her two sons, Danny and David; two sisters, one brother, and her parents.

Those left to mourn her death is her daughter Ruth, two grandsons Edward and Charles; two great-granddaughters, Anna and Ivy; and a sister Shirley.
