

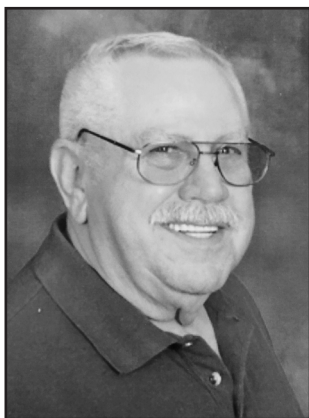
Clyde Cecil Pickett
