

**MRS. A. O. ALEXANDER
PASSED AWAY OCTOBER 21**

Cora Dourte Alexander, daughter of John and Amelia Dourte, was born at Nebraska City, Nebr., August 5, 1870, and passed away at her home in Arnold, Nebr., Friday, October 21, 1938. While yet in infancy, her parents moved to Mountayr, Iowa, where she resided until she was 14 years old. In the meantime her mother had passed away, and she moved with her father and three brothers to Logan county, Nebraska, where she made her home until 1894. In 1894 she was united in marriage to A. O. Alexander and resided in Lincoln county until the spring of 1914. To this union were born five children: Warren Alexander of Kearney, Nebr.; Harold Nolan Alexander of Kansas City, Mo.; Alvie H. Alexander, who preceded her in death; Ralph E. Alexander of Arnold, Nebr.; and Constance Alexander Smith of Kearney, Nebr. Besides her immediate family, she leaves three daughters-in-law, Lydia E., Mable and Irene; one son-in-law, Richard L. Smith; three brothers, E. J., S. B. and M. J. Dourte; and two half-brothers, H. O. and C. P. Dourte. She had seven grand-children and a large number of more distant relatives.

Mrs. Alexander was a charter member of the Arnold Rebekah Lodge, was a Past Noble Grand, and Secretary for a number of terms. She was a worker in the Christian Science church and a faithful wife and mother.
