

LORNA BELLE ADAMS PASSED AWAY NOV. 25

People of this community were greatly saddened Saturday afternoon when it became known that Lorna Belle Adams, youngest child of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Adams, had passed away after a serious illness of only a few hours. She was quite suddenly stricken early that morning, and was immediately removed to the hospital where every effort humanly possible was made to relieve her. However, the little girl failed rapidly, and passed away about four o'clock that afternoon.

Lorna Belle was born in Arnold, February 27, 1926, and had reached the age of 13 years, 8 months and 28 days. She was an exceptionally pleasant and lovable child, happy and obedient and always desiring to be of help to everyone. These fine qualities had endeared her to every one of her acquaintances and made her a great favorite with all of her associates.

As early as her age would permit Lorna Belle became a member of the Girl Scout organization, and entered into that splendid work with the energy, determination and enthusiasm that were so characteristic of her. Rapidly advancing in her school work, she was a member of the freshman class of Arnold high school, and had been a leader in class and school activities. She had also been active in

4-H club work for some time, and her excellent talent was much in evidence in the progress she made there as it was in all that she undertook. She was regularly found in her place at the Methodist Sunday School, and had achieved results in her work and developed a character most highly creditable for a girl of her years.

Although unusually active in all of the various kinds of work that she undertook, Lorna Belle had never been physically rugged, and was unable to overcome the very serious illness which attacked her so suddenly.

Besides her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Adams, she leaves one sister, Jane; two brothers, Robert and Howard; a number of other relatives, and many, many loving friends.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon, November 28, at two o'clock at the home with Rev. C. R. Garver in charge. Misses Nellie and Tressie Hartman and Gayle Dennis sang three beautiful hymns, accompanied at the piano by Margaret Naylor. Members of the Girl Scout organization and of the freshman class of the Arnold high school attended the services in a body and the scouts assisted in various ways.
