

## Gilmore Baker Rites Held Feb. 9

Funeral services for Gilmore Baker were held at the Quig Funeral home in Arnold at 2 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 9, with the Rev. Herman Fales, pastor of the Arnold Church of the Nazarene, in charge.

Gilmore Baker, son of David and Sarah Baker, was born July 17, 1873, at Wathena, Kans., and died Feb. 6, 1958, at the age of 85 years, seven months and 12 days.

When he was two years old, his parents moved by covered wagon to Iowa, near Decatur, where he grew to manhood. He was of a large family, all of whom preceded him in death except his youngest sister, Mrs. Lilly Tousley of Independence, Mo.

Gilmore, or Gill as he was better known, was a twin. His twin brother, Filmore of Olathia, Kans., preceded him in death. Other brothers and sisters who preceded him in death were Henry Baker, Grand Island, Daniel Baker, Shenandoah, Ia., James Baker, Independence, Mo., Francis McKenzie, Lee's Summit, Mo., Clara Smith, Kansas City, Mo., and Addie Leeper, Tarkio, Mo.

He is survived by one sister, Mrs. Lilly Tousley, many nieces, nephews and friends.

Baker had made his home in Nebraska with his later years spent in Arnold.
