Glenn Lee Bailey, seven-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Lee H. Bailey, passed away Tuesday morning at the family home following an illness of several weeks. The little lad contracted a bad case of scarlet fever when about three years old, and while seeming to recover, his condition was such that when he suffered the flu about the first of January, the after effects of the scarlet fever developed.

Funeral services were conducted this (Thursday) afternoon at the Baptist church, with Rev. J. Ross Fountain in charge. A quartette, Mrs. Charles Nansel, Mrs. John Melton, Cecil Pearce and Glenn L.
