

Services Held For Mrs. Mamie Atkins

Funeral services were held on Monday afternoon, December 21 at 2:00 P.M., from the Baptist Church in Arnold for Mrs. Mamie M. Atkins who died in North Platte, Nebraska on December 17.

On April 1, 1906, she was united in marriage to Joseph G. Atkins. To this union were born seven children.

Soon after their marriage, they moved to Nebraska where they farmed around Hastings, Davenport and Edgar. In 1929 she moved to the Arnold community and resided there until her death.
