

Nathan S. Allen, son of Joseph and Anna Allen, was born at Marion, Ind., March 19, 1845, and died at Broken Bow, Nebraska, August 8, 1929. His boyhood days were spent in his native state and Michigan. In 1864 he enlisted in the United States army, being associated with the First Michigan Sharp Shooters, and served for a period of eleven months.

He was united in marriage to Miss Luctia Restine on September 19, 1891 at Gothenburg, Nebraska. To this union were born two daughters, Mrs. Gertrude Henderson and Mrs. Inez Alexander, both residing at Broken Bow at this time. His wife preceded him in death in 1914. He homesteaded in Custer, settling near Etna and his home has been in Custer county since that time. He was raised in the faith of the Quaker church and united with the Methodist Episcopal church at Gothenburg when a young man, his membership was transferred to the Methodist church at Arnold eighteen years ago where it has remained since, where he worshipped faithfully during his residence there.

Death came at the close of an active life, after an illness of ten days.

He is survived by his two daughters, Mrs. Gertrude Henderson and Mrs. Inez Alexander of Broken Bow, eleven grandchildren, two brothers and one sister, residing in the state of Indiana.
