

## PAUL EMERY ALEXANDER

Paul Emery Alexander, son of Phines and Alice Alexander, was born in Lincoln County March 30, 1900 and died in Ogallala, on July 25, 1957 at the age of 57 years, 3 months and 25 days.

He was the youngest boy of eleven children, and received his early schooling and grew to young manhood in the community where he was born.

On Jan. 21, 1922 he was united in marriage to Miss Violet Bartholomew at Broken Bow, and they established their first home on the homestead where he was raised. To this union eight children were born.

Mr. and Mrs. Alexander moved to North Platte in 1932 and in 1954 they moved to Roscoe where they have since resided.

Mr. Alexander united with the Methodist Church in Arnold at an early age and remained in that faith throughout his life.

He was preceded in death by two sons, Virgil Lee and Marlin Gayle.

Survivors include his wife; four daughters, Mrs. Robert Trobee of Arnold; Mrs. Clarence Fricke, Mrs. Fred Fricke and Mrs. John Gray, all of Roscoe; two sons, Archie Leonard of North Platte and Elmer Dale of Roscoe; 21 grandchildren; three brothers, Lloyd and Herbert, both of Oregon, and Lessel of Arnold; three sisters, Mrs. Ollie Dailey of Arnold; Mrs. Henry Veith of Arnold, and Mrs. Casper Zulkoski of Sacramento, Calif., and a host of friends and relatives.

Funeral services were held at 9 a.m. at the Bracken Memorial Chapel and at 3 p.m. in the Methodist Church in Arnold July 29.
