

**SMALL SON OF MR. AND MRS. JOHN
TWISS DIES MONDAY.**

Following an illness of measles and whooping cough, and later an attack of the flu, Bobbie Twiss passed away at the home of his parents in this city last Monday, March 31, 1930.

Funeral services were held at the Christian church Wednesday afternoon, with Rev. L. S. Burnham in charge of the service, and P. G. Houghton, Mrs. John Taylor, Mrs. George Bailey and C. B. Peaslee acting as singers. Interment was made in the Arnold cemetery.

Bobbie Allen Twiss
was born at Rockford, Ill., August 27, 1926, and came with his parents to Arnold in June 1929. About six weeks ago he was taken sick with measles from which he contracted intestinal trouble that did not yield to treatment and he gradually grew weaker until the angel came and bade him join the band at home, to rest from suffering and partake of the joys of heaven, and on Monday afternoon, March 31, 1930, he left us to join his sister Mary who preceded him on January 27, 1929.
