Funeral services for Henry Dunker

evening at the home of his son, Henry.

Obituary.

Henry John Joseph Dunker was
born October 9, 1844, at Friedlaufs-
Scheln, Germany. In 1869 he came to
America, stopping first in Chicago,
thence to Dakota, the western states,
and in eastern Nebraska, and in 1864
he settled on a homestead near Ring-
gold, Nebr. The territory surrounding
this place has been his home since
that time. In 1884 he was united in
marriage to Florence Tina Link, and to
this union was born fourteen children,
twelve of whom survive the father:
Charles, Henry, Festus, Mrs. Sophia
Jensen, Esther all of Arnold, Nebr.;
Mrs. Anna Lesich of Gibbon, Nebr.;
Martin of Arthur, Nebr.; Albert of
Kimball, Nebr.; Walter of Henry,
Nebr.; John, Richard and Jess all of
Gandy, Nebr. Two children preceded
their father to the eternal rest, as did
his wife, who passed away in 1917.

In early life Mr. Dunker united with
the German Lutheran church, main-
taining his membership throughout
his life. Mr. Dunker was a hard work-
er as long as he was physically able.
About one and a half years ago, the
dread cancer attacked and despite
medical treatment it finally claimed
him as a victim on June 20, 1929 at the
age of 84 years, 8 months and 21 days.
Besides his children he leaves one sis-
ter and 17 grandchildren and many
friends and neighbors to miss him.
