

Mrs. E. L. Hunt Dead; Was Arnold Pioneer

Mary Elizabeth Hunt was born February 5, 1871, in West Virginia, and passed away April 5, 1936, at Arnold, Nebraska, at the age of 65 years and two months.

In her childhood she lived at Ravenna, Nebraska, and later moved to Anselmo. She was married to Mr. J. E. Hunt in 1890. About 1907 they moved to Arnold where Mrs. Hunt made her home until the time of her death.

In early life Mrs. Hunt united with the Christian church. Mrs. Hunt was the mother of ten children, two of whom, Hubert Franklin and Charles Edward, have preceded her in death. Her surviving children are Albert Hunt of Arnold, Frances, Raymond and wife, Lloyd and Bertland, all of Veteran, Wyo.; Mrs. Ross Rasler of Steilacoon, Washington; Lillie Rasler of Bremerton, Washington, and Miss Della Hunt of Westland, Wyoming. Nine grandchildren also survive.

A large number of neighbors and friends share with her relatives their bereavement in this hour of their sorrow.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at one o'clock at the Methodist church with Rev. C. L. VanMetre in charge. Mr. and Mrs. Lee Foster, Mrs. H. A.
